**Josef Feigelson** was born in Latvia but is now living in the United States. He is recognized as one of the foremost cellists of his time. From studying under the renowned Mstislav Rostropovich to pioneering the music of Mieczyslaw Weinberg, he has helped define a daring role for the cello in contemporary music. He has performed at major concert halls in the United States and in Europe, and as a chamber music player he has collaborated with some of the world's best known musicians. In addition, he has given master classes to string players at many venues across the United States and Europe.

Pianist **Peep Lassmann** is well known in his native country of Estonia and around the world. His solo appearances and collaborations with other musicians have taken him throughout Europe, the United States and Asia. Since 1991 he has been the Rector of the Estonian Music Academy. Lassmann's repertoire is extremely varied and includes music from different periods and styles. He has recorded a solo album of Estonian piano music, as well as Piano Preludes by the renowned Estonian composer Arvo Pärt.
